In accordance with Articles 15-16 of the CUPE 4600 Collective Agreement Unit 2, the Department of Earth Sciences invites qualified applicants to apply to teach the following courses during the **2017 Fall and 2018 Winter Terms**.

Fall Term 2017

ERTH 2415 Natural Disasters

The minimum requirement for qualified applicants applying to teach EARTH 2415, "Natural Disasters" is a Ph.D. in science or engineering, and previous teaching experience. Practical experience in the study of natural hazards and/or the mitigation of natural disasters is an asset. The previous recorded videos from EARTH 2415 might not be available and the instructor should teach in the classroom or on CUOL.

ERTH 3405 Geophysical Methods

The minimum requirement for qualified applicants applying to teach EARTH 3405, "Geophysical Methods" is a Ph.D. in Earth Sciences, Expertise in Geophysics, and previous teaching experience. Experience in theoretical and applied geophysical methods is an asset.

ERTH 4820 Research Methods in Earth Sciences

The minimum requirement for qualified applicants applying to teach EARTH 4003, "Research Methods in Earth Sciences" is a Ph.D. in science with experience in research and analytical methods.

Winter Term 2018

ERTH 2403 Introduction to Oceanography

The minimum requirement for qualified applicants applying to teach EARTH 2403, "Introduction to Oceanography" is a Ph.D. in Earth Sciences with expertise in the subject area, and previous teaching experience.

ERTH 2404 Engineering Geoscience

The minimum requirement for qualified applicants applying to teach EARTH 2404, "Engineering Geoscience:" is a Ph.D. in science or engineering, expertise in the subject area and previous teaching experience.

ERTH 3002 Gemology

The minimum requirement for qualified applicants applying to teach EARTH 3002 "Gemology" is a Ph.D. in Earth Sciences, expertise and previous teaching experience in the subject area.

ERTH 3113 Geology of Human Origins

The minimum requirement for qualified applicants applying to teach EARTH 3113 "Geology of Human Origins" is normally a M.Sc. degree with expertise in the subject area and previous teaching experience.

ERTH 4707/5707 Engineering Seismology

The minimum requirement for qualified applicants applying to teach ERTH 4707/ERTH 5707, "Engineering Seismology" is a Ph.D. in Earth Sciences, Expertise in Seismology, and previous teaching experience. Practical experience in Engineering Seismology is an asset.
